No new NMB postings naming **United Airlines** or **JetBlue Airways** appeared since the last September 2025 Weekly Activity Reports. The NMB website currently notes it is not being updated during a funding lapse, so official postings may be delayed.

United-AFA (Flight Attendants)

- Mediation docket: Case A-14065 (United-AFA) remains the active mediation file opened December 2023; mediator reassigned to Michael Kelliher in November 2024.
- Public scheduling update: AFA's negotiations site shows the Oct 29–31,
 2025 bargaining session proceeded without an NMB mediator due to the federal shutdown; next dates listed Dec 9–12, 2025 (additional dates into early 2026).
- Mediator assignment confirmation: AFA notes the same NMB mediator (Michael Kelliher) remains assigned.

NMB representation/related determinations in 2025

- United (IBT) A/C Inspectors accretion: On Mar 4, 2025 the Board found
 United's Assistant Manager Aircraft Inspection (Outside Vendor) positions fall within
 IBT's Mechanics & Related craft/class and dismissed the application after accretion;
 on Apr 23, 2025 the Board denied United's motion for reconsideration.
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- Alaska–Hawaiian (pilots/FA & other crafts) single-carrier: In Mar–Jun 2025 the
 Board issued single-carrier findings (e.g., AFA Flight Attendants on Mar 6, 2025,
 with follow-on certifications for other groups). Included here as a recent benchmark
 affecting airline labor scope; no bearing on United/JetBlue filings.

JetBlue

 No new 2025 NMB filings found referencing JetBlue on the FY2025 Determinations list (most recent JetBlue representation actions were in 2023/2022).

Site/feeds checked

- NMB Weekly Activity Reports (through Sept 26, 2025) show no new mediation dockets or reassignments relevant to United/JetBlue; page banners indicate updates paused during the appropriations lapse.
- NMB Press Releases (FY2025) contain no United/JetBlue mediation notices.

Notes: Given the NMB's posted **lapse in appropriations**, absence of new postings after late September may reflect delayed publishing rather than lack of activity.
